

# Modest or Ommodest Dress?

s Summer temperatures rise standards of modesty seem to fall. Very few people, including many who claim to be Christians, are concerned about modesty.

We live in an age that glorifies immodesty and immorality. On almost every commercial advertisement, whether it be on a billboard, television, or in a magazine, and regardless if the advertised product is food, clothing, perfume, or automobiles, the allurement is not the product itself, but men and women who are dressed immodestly.

Thus, immodesty has become so commonly excepted that it doesn't bother most people. Most people feel no shame if they see someone on television or in public who is dressed immodestly, and wouldn't have any problem dressing the same

The Israelites were condemned by God through the prophet Jeremiah because they no longer had any shame. "Were they ashamed when they had committed abomination? nay, they were not at all ashamed, neither could they blush: therefore shall they fall among them that fall: in the time of their visitation they shall be cast down, saith the Lord." (Jer. 8:12). Are you able to blush at that which is sinful? Do you blush at the shame of immodest dress?

Immodest dress is the type of dress that brings attention to ones body, to expose one's nakedness either by thin, tight, or revealing clothing. Immodest dress has always been sinful in the sight of God. When Adam and Eve's eyes were opened to sin and shame they realized their nakedness and made for themselves aprons of fig leaves and covered their loins and hid from God. But those little aprons they made for themselves, which probably covered up more than many popular swimsuits of today, were not enough to satisfy God; for we are told, "Unto Adam also and to his wife did the Lord God make coats of skins, and clothed them" (Gen. 3:7-21). With what they had on, God did not consider them to be clothed. What they were wearing was shameful and they had reason to hide. Many today could learn a lesson from Adam and Eve and clothe themselves, covering their nakedness and shame.

Styles of clothes are not specified in God's Word. We don't have to wear tunics and turbans today-- styles change and they are different from nation to nation, age to age, and even person to person. Each person can enjoy different styles of dress as long as they do not violate the principle of God's Word.

However, just because something is "in style" doesn't mean that it is modest. Just because it is hot outside, or because one may be involved in a certain activity doesn't change God's principles and standards. The standards of God never goes out of style-- "Heaven and earth shall pass away, but My words shall not pass away" (Mat.24:35). The Scriptures declare in I Tim. 2:9, "In like manner also, that women adorn themselves in modest apparel..." (These principles also apply to men as well).

If you ever have any trouble choosing proper clothing to wear in public just ask yourself, "Would I want to be wearing this if the Lord returned? Would I want to be wearing this as I stood before God in judgment?" Knowing that nakedness is shameful and immodesty is sinful, you should be able to dress in a manner pleasing to God regardless of the activity in which you will be involved, or what the temperature is.

# SPEND MORE TIME WITH **SCREENS THAN PEOPLE**

An "introvert economy" has come to define America's

post-lockdown culture, according to the Manhattan Institute's Allison Schrager in *Bloomberg Opinion*.

"The time at home made Americans less fun," Schrager reported Monday. "In general Americans are going out less. And odds are it will stick: It is the youngest adults who are going out less, and when they do go out, it is earlier." Even when they do go out, she notes, "the data show they are also less likely to drink."

"Gen Z is shaping up to be the most sober generation in U history," Schrager wrote. "Singles are also less likely to approach each other in public, preferring the anonymity and clear social boundaries of online meeting. This means less need to be out."

When making plans for the weekends, more Americans are trading real-life social interactions for at-home digital entertainment, whether it be video games or television, according to Labor Department data Schrager cites.

The data reflects an accelerating trend since lockdowns: mor and more Americans are seduced by cheap dopamine hits from the couch. Americans emerged from government-mandated lockdowns feeling more isolated and depressed. They were left to cope with the comforts of Netflix and an easy stream of addictive ready-to-eat ultra-processed food. According to the Shelby Report a Georgia-based publication for the food and grocery industry snack sales on items such as cookies, crackers, chips, and more jumped \$10 billion from 2020 to 2022.

Are Americans happier as a result?

Research published in 2021 suggests no, with study findings that "indicate that the rate of serious mental health issues such as depression and anxiety have more than doubled in the USA during the pandemic." In May last year, a Gallup poll revealed Americans are more depressed than ever, with nearly 1 in 3 reporting a diagnosis at least once in their lifetime.

#### **NEWS OF INTEREST TO CHRISTIANS**

□ THE REJECTION OF PRE-TRIB RAPTURE'S ROLE IN THE DOWNFALL OF CONSERVATIVE **BAPTISTS** - In his history of the downfall of the Conservative Baptists, Richard Clearwaters emphasized the importance of the Pre-Tribulation Rapture several times. He showed that one of the principles of both theological modernism and New Evangelicalism is the denial of the imminency of the return of Christ and a replacement of a concentrated focus on the Great Commission of world evangelism with a kingdom building emphasis. Clearwaters observed that one of the elements of the downgrade was "a more tolerant attitude toward varying views of eschatology."

In 1956, he wrote, "Students have gone from Northwestern [founded by W.B. Riley and Pre-Trib from its inception] and other similar schools to these schools [Fuller Seminary and Denver Conservative Baptist Seminary] with a simple faith in the Word of God about the Rapture of the Church and the Second Coming only to later come to me disturbed, not knowing whether they were now looking for Christ to rapture His Church or for Anti-Christ; whether the 'blessed hope' of the church was half or all of the Tribulation; whether Christ was coming with His Church or for His Church" (The Great Conservative Baptist Compromise, chapter 3, "The Bible, the Unchanging Evangelical," p. 48). Clearwaters observed, "The only contribution made by rethinking eschatology has been a glorified question mark" (p. 49). Clearwaters emphasized that the dispensational pre-tribulational doctrine is established by a consistent literal method of interpretation (p. 50) and the early Christians believed in and were looking for the imminent return of Christ (p. 197).

The prominent role of post-tribulationism in the downfall of the Conservative Baptists was emphasized in the report "Conservative Baptist Cross Currents in Colorado," published in May 1962 in the Baptist Missionary-Evangelist. Written by four preachers who the 1940s, it documented the invasion of new evangelicalism. They emphasized that one of the ways the new evangelicalism showed itself was in the rejection of dispensational pre-tribulation

"By 1954 it was evident that the [Denver Baptist Theological] Seminary had introduced a doctrine foreign to Colorado Conservative Baptists--the accepted dispensational premise was being abandoned in favor of reformation theology. In relation to this position is the theory of the post-tribulation rapture of the church. Dr. Burdick is reported to hold strongly to this 'post-trib' position, and President Vernon Grounds has stated, 'As for myself, pretribulationist. ... □ SOCIAL MEDIA THE GREAT VOYEURISTIC TALEBEARER - "Hell and destruction are never full; so the eyes of man are never satisfied" (Proverbs 27:20). "Where no wood is, there the fire goeth out: so where there is no talebearer, the strife ceaseth" (Proverbs 26:20).

Among other things, social media is a massive forum for voyeurism. This word is from the French voir, meaning to see. It has a large sexual element (i.e., Peeping Tom), which is evident throughout social media, but it is by no means limited to that. It refers to "a fascination with the private lives of others." It is "the practice of taking pleasure in observing something private, sordid, or scandalous" (Merriam-Webster). It is associated with talebearing, gossip, tattling, rumor-mongering, busybodiness, and character assassination. It is an appetite of the fallen nature or "old man," which is a bottomless pit of depravity.

Mankind tends to think of itself as basically good, with some "bad apples," but God's Word paints an entirely different picture. Every single individual, apart from the new birth, is described like this: "Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers, Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful: Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them" (Romans 1:29-32).

Jesus gave the same description: "For from within, out of the heart of men, proceed evil thoughts, adulteries, fornications, murders, Thefts, covetousness, wickedness, deceit, lasciviousness, an evil eye, blasphemy, pride, foolishness" (Mark 7:21-22). Since all of these evils are in man's heart, he derives endless enjoyment from seeing and hearing these things.

The psalmist said, "I will set no wicked thing before mine eyes: I hate the work of them that turn aside; it shall not cleave to me' (Psalm 101:3). The day he decided not to do this was the day he damaged his good reputation.
